## From the Podium

Every summer, I look forward to announcing YOSA's concert season. What wonderful soloists and great orchestral masterpieces will we present this year? Pulling back the curtain on our artistic plans is always a thrill.

Like everything else in the time of the COVID-19 pandemic, however, this year's announcement is very different. We do not know for sure when we will be able to gather a full orchestra together safely in person. When we can have an orchestra perform together, will we be able to accommodate an audience? All of us have been forced to become more comfortable with uncertainty, but it is no fun to face so many unknowns.

Happily, though, we know that YOSA will be making music in September. More than 440 young musicians have confirmed their intention to join 14 different YOSA groups for the 2020/21 concert season. Eight string orchestras and six smaller ensembles for woodwind, brass, and percussion players will begin rehearsals this fall. When public health conditions and local school district guidance allow, we will offer in-person rehearsals—with families given the option to participate online instead, if they would prefer. And when we cannot meet in person, all groups will still learn and make music together via Zoom every Sunday.

On December 19 & 20, we will present a series of performances featuring all 14 YOSA groups at the Tobin Center for the Performing Arts. We hope to welcome a live audience, but we could also livestream these performances from the Tobin stage via YouTube. And if we are not able to perform in person, we will release recorded or virtual performances instead.

We are hopeful that all our groups will be able to perform before an in-person audience in May 2021. Mark your calendars now for the YOSA Philharmonic's spring Zachry Series concert on May 23, 2021 at the Tobin Center. Anthony McGill, principal clarinetist of the New York Philharmonic, will be our guest soloist, thanks to generous support from the Russell Hill Rogers Fund for the Arts.

While we do not know for sure what the next several months will hold, we are excited to start rehearsals and make music together. ### **YOSA Live Chats**

YOSA Music Director Troy Peters hosted ten YOSA Live Chats this summer with luminaries of classical music, including composers, conductors, and performers from around the world. The conversations were broadcast live on the YOSA YouTube channel. Viewers were able to be a part of the chat by posting their questions and comments during the stream. Guests shared their unique journeys that brought them to their careers in music. They also offered valuable insight and advice for the young musicians tuning in. Live Chat guests included Pulitzer Prize-winning composer Jennifer Higdon, conductor Akiko Fujimoto, Grammy-nominated flutist Joshua Smith, and many more.





















### **YOSA Concert Playbacks**

YOSA took a trip down memory lane this summer with YOSA Concert Playbacks. For the first time ever, three past YOSA concerts were broadcast live on the YOSA Facebook page. Concerts included *New World Landscapes* from the 2018/2019 season, *At the Movies* with the San Antonio Chamber Choir from the 2019/20 season, and *Purple Rain Live* from the 2017/18 season. *New World Landscapes* also included a special interview with visual artist Adrian Wyard, and *At the Movies* included a discussion with San Antonio Chamber Choir Artistic Director Rick Bjella. During the Facebook stream, viewers were able to react and comment on the concert streams in real time and send their virtual applause with reactions and emojis.







## **YOSA presents San Antonio Sounds**

YOSA presents San Antonio Sounds is a series of virtual performance collaborations with YOSA and local San Antonio artists in a wide variety of musical styles. YOSA Music Director Troy Peters worked with the guest artists to arrange an orchestral accompaniment to one of their original songs. After YOSA musicians and the guest artists record their parts individually, they are edited together into a virtual performance video. Performance collaborations premiered throughout the summer with **Demitasse**, **Nicolette Good**, **Alyson Alonzo**, and San Antonio Poet Laureate **Andrea** "**Vocab**" **Sanderson**.









## YOSA Virtual Summer Symphony Camp

YOSA Summer Symphony Camp offered a week-long virtual session with unique opportunities for orchestral studies and alternative musical styles. Campers honed their skills, met new friends, and performed exciting music in virtual rehearsals and classes.

Summer Symphony Camp consisted of three orchestras: Brahms Orchestra, Haydn Orchestra, and Orchestra X. Campers participated in daily instrumental instruction with their orchestra conductor and sectional coaches. Campers also participated in an elective class, selecting a session in music theory, music appreciation, or conducting.

Camp concluded with a virtual performance of unique proportions. On the final day of camp, musicians recorded their solo performance of their orchestra's music and submitted the video to be included in the final virtual orchestra video.

Meeting via Zoom was certainly a unique experience for campers, and the YOSA Summer Symphony Camp team made the week fun, exciting, and engaging. Each day, there was a camp-wide theme to participate in. From crazy hat day to bring your pet to rehearsal day, the virtual setting offered new opportunities to take the place of inperson activities. Campers were still able to connect with each other and make music together from miles away.
